


St. Patrick's Day Parade

This is where the Club gets the funds which we donate to help kids that live in the Ocala Forrest, Local Food banks, Veterans helping Veterans, and many more local charities who help those who may be a little less fortunate than we are.

2. Last year we raised just over \$21,000. This where the donations come from when we give out the big checks at our phlockings.

3. This is a Phun day that our members, phamily, phriends, and neighbors can all participate in so let everyone know. And we need your participation. We moved it back a few days so not to interfere with St. Patrick's day.

4. There are 2 portions of our poker run, 1st the Poker run itself: It only cost \$5 per hand to enter. You can purchase as many hands as you like. You can start at any of the locations: Colony Cottage Rec center, Seabreeze Rec center, Havana CC, and/or Palmers CC. We finish at Laurel Manor Rec Center with a Basket raffle/festival. Most of what I do is facilitate communications with our club members. Communications, in the Parrot Head Club is kind of like a three-legged stool, (a) Mark sends out ParrotHead News emails to keep everyone current, and reviews upcoming events at phlockings, (b)



flyers and information links are posted on the Parrot Heads Club webpages, and (c) the Parrot Heads Facebook pages serves as a discussion forum, with pictures and other information.

The Facebook pages have a lot of information and are monitored to ensure postings are in line with established guidelines (show respect, etc).

With regard to the Parrothead News emails, we have about 1,200 members and the numbers keep climbing. Of the 1,200 members, a bunch have duplicate email addresses (mostly spouses), and roughly 50 or so are unsubscribed or marked as spam. That leaves roughly 1,050 unique email addresses for distribution of Mark's Parrot Head News emails, or roughly 90% of our membership. There has been a lot of efforts in February welcoming over 100 new members and making sure everything goes smoothly. Looking forward, March and April appear to be busy months with the Anniversary Party, Poker Run, Blood Drive, Land Sharks Concert, Homosassa, St Patrick's Day Parade and Luau, and a lot more. Plus, you can count on the travel committee to come up with a lot of good ideas. It might seem chaotic at first, but we have good processes in place and everything goes relatively smoothly. We'll be sure to stay on top of the web pages, to keep you current on the phun activities being planned.

Meet Shella Hughes

When Judy Koch stepped back to an Adviosry Role with the Travel Committee, Shella stepped up and is now the Club's Travel Trustee. I asked her some questions and following are her answers: 1) When did you move to the Villages and where did you come from? We came to The Villages in



2005 while looking at retirement options for my sister. I decided on that lifestyle visit that I was going to live here someday. Bought a home in Village of Sunset Pointe in 2011 but we were not yet ready to retire. Niels Jansen and I visited frequently and finally made the permanent move in December, 2017.

2) What did you do before you retired? During my 44 year career, I worked for 3 non-profit organizations: Blue Cross, Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical enter, and Children, Inc. I started working right out of high school and attended the University of Cincinnati in the evening and on weekends. {Tuition was paid for by the company if you got good grades!} After 16 years, I moved on to Children's Hospital where I was an Office Manager for The Cincinnati Center for Developmental Disorders. Ten years later a former co-worker recommended I become the Director of Human Resources for Children, Inc. (now called Learning Grove) in Northern Kentucky where I retired from 18 years later. I believe my career has been mostly focused on customer service. My customers being policy holders, patients/parents, and employees.

3) Why did you join the Parrot Head Club and why have you remained a member? Niels and I were both born and raised in Cincinnati, Ohio. Cincinnati is famous for chili but more importantly for Jimmy Buffett concerts. Jimmy held 3 sold out concerts in Cincinnati every summer. The song "Fins" is a source of pride for the locals"She came down from CINCINNATI, it took her three days on a train." The Parrot Heads was the first club we joined in 2018. We shared a table with another couple and quickly became friends. Everyone we met was friendly and smiling! We learned how much good this club did for our "new home town" and the surrounding areas and they did it while having FUN!

4) What are your goals for the Travel Committee? Goals for the Travel Committee are in the planning stage. The Committee developed an Activity Survey that is currently being distributed at phlockings. After the results are counted I will share the results with the Board. We want to be able to offer trips that are of interest to our members and keep the ideas fresh. We will encourage new members to "co-host" a trip that is of interest to them. New members will always be paired up with an experienced member so they can watch and learn.

I think participating on the committee or going on one of the day trips is a great way to get to meet members and make new friends. You have the chance to sit and talk to others on the bus and perhaps share a table at lunch or sit near them at the event.






